

## AUSBREAKING SUPPORT PROGRAM (ASP) TERMS AND CONDITIONS

## **Definitions**

AUSBreaking - the recognised national body for the Australian breaking community WDSF - the recognised International Federation (IF) representing breaking as a sport in the Olympics, World DanceSport Federation

DSA - the recognised National Federation (NF) representing breaking as a sport in the Olympics, DanceSport Australia

IOC - the global organisation that conducts, promotes and regulates the modern Olympic Games and is the supreme authority of the Olympic Movement, International Olympic Committee

Olympic participant - a bgirl/bboy who participates in ABA ranked events and/or WDSF/IOC events as part of the Olympic Qualification System, for Olympic purposes

To be eligible for consideration of Australian delegation and/or support:

- 1. You must be registered for the ASP.
- 2. You must comply with the rules and requirements for each opportunity presented to be eligible for receipt of support
- 3. Olympic participants must meet the athlete eligibility requirements as seen in the Paris 2024 Qualification System for Breaking
